


# PROGRAMMABLE MICROWAVE OVEN USER'S MANUAL REF. MWO25P



Please read these instructions carefully before installing and operating the oven.

Please save sales receipt for warranty.



## PRECAUTIONS TO AVOID POSSIBLE EXPOSURE TO EXCESSIVE MICROWAVE ENERGY

- 1. Do not attempt to operate this oven with the door-open since open-door operation can result in harmful exposure to microwave energy. It is important not to defeat or tamper with the safety interlocks.
- 2. Do not place any object between the oven front face and the door or allow soil or cleaner residue to accumulate on sealing surfaces.
- 3. Do not operate the oven if it is damaged. It is particularly important that the oven door close properly and that there is no damage to the:
  - a. Door (bent),
  - b. Hinges and latches (broken or loosened),
  - c. Door seals and sealing surfaces.
- 4. The oven should not be adjusted or repaired by anyone except properly qualified service personnel

## **IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS:**

When using electrical appliance basic safety precautions should be followed, including the following:

WARNING! To reduce the risk of burns, electric shock, fire, injury to persons or exposure to excessive microwave energy:

- 1. Read all instructions before using the appliance and keep for future reference.
- 2. Use this appliance only for its intended use as described in the manual. Do not use corrosive chemicals or vapors in this appliance. This type of oven is specifically designed to heat, cook or dry food. It is not designed for industrial or laboratory use.
- 3. Do not operate the oven when empty.
- 4. Do not operate this appliance if it has a damaged cord or plug, if it is not working properly, or if it has been damaged or dropped. If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer or its service agent or a similarly qualified person in order to avoid a hazard.
- 5. WARNING!--Only allow children to use the oven without supervision when adequate instructions have been given so that the child is able to use the oven in a safe way and understands the hazards of improper use.
- 6. To reduce the risk of fire in the oven cavity:
  - a. When heating food in plastic or paper container, check the oven frequently to the possibility of ignition
  - b. Remove wire twist-ties from paper or plastic bags before placing bag in oven.
  - c. If smoke is observed, switch off or unplug the appliance and keep the door closed in order to stifle any flames.
  - d. Do not use the cavity for storage purposes. Do not leave paper products, cooking utensils, or food in the cavity when not in use.
  - e. The microwave oven is intended for heating food and beverages. Drying of clothing and heating of warming pads, slippers, sponges, damp cloth and similar may lead to risk of injury, ignition or fire.
- 7. WARNING! Liquid or other food must not be heated in sealed containers since they are liable to explode.
- 8. Microwave heating of beverage can result in delayed eruptive boiling, therefore care has to be taken when handle the container.
- 9. Do not fry food in the oven. Hot oil can damage oven parts and utensils and even result in skin burns.
- 10. Eggs in their shell and whole hard-boiled eggs should not be heated in microwave ovens since they may explode even after microwave heating has ended.
- 11. Pierce foods with heavy skins such as potatoes, whole squashes, apples and chestnuts before cooking.
- 12. The contents of feeding bottles and baby jars should be stirred or shaken and the temperature should be checked before serving in order to avoid burns.
- 13. Cooking utensils may become hot because of heat transferred from the heated food. Potholders may be needed to handle the utensil.
- 14. Utensils should be checked to ensure that they are suitable for use in microwave oven.
- 15. WARNING!--It is hazardous for anyone other than a trained person to carry out any service or repair operation which involves the removal of any cover which gives protection against exposure to microwave energy.



- 16. This product is a Group 2 Class B ISM equipment. The definition of Group 2 which contains all ISM (Industrial, Scientific and Medical) equipment in which radio-frequency energy is intentionally generated and/or used in the form of electromagnetic radiation for the treatment of material, and spark erosion equipment. For Class B equipment is equipment suitable for use in domestic establishments and in establishments directly connected to a low voltage power supply network which supplies buildings used for domestic purpose.
- 17. This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- 18. Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- 19. The microwave oven is only used in freestanding.
- 20. WARNING!--Do not install oven over a range cook top or other heat-producing appliance. If installed could be damaged and the warranty would be avoid .
- 21. The microwave oven shall not be placed in a cabinet.
- 22. The door or the outer surface may get hot when the appliance is operating.
- 23. Warning: Accessible parts may become hot during use. Young children should be kept away.
- 24. During use the appliances becomes hot. Care should be taken to avoid touching heating elements inside the oven, for cooking ranged and ovens.
- 25. The temperature of accessible surfaces may be high when the appliance is operating.
- 26. The appliance shall be placed against a wall.
- 27. Appliance is not to be used by children or persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction.
- 28. WARNING!--If the door or door seals are damaged, the oven must not be operated until it has been repaired by a competent person.
- 29. The instructions shall state that appliances are not intended to be operated by means of an external timer or separate remote-control system.
- 30. The microwave oven is for commercial use.
- 31. Never remove the distance holder in the back or on the sides, as it ensures a minimum distance from the wall for air circulation.
- 32. Please secure the turntable before you move the appliance to avoid damages.
- 33. CAUTION!--It is dangerous to repair or maintain the appliance by no other than a specialist because under these circumstances the cover have to be removed which assures protection against microwave radiation. This applies to changing the power cord or the lighting as well. Send the appliance in these cases to our service centre.
- 34. The microwave oven is intended for defrosting, cooking and steaming of food only.
- 35. Use gloves if you remove any heated food.
- 36. Caution! Steam will escape, when opening lids or wrapping foil.
- 37. This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children unless they are aged from 8 years and above and supervised.
- 38. If smoke is emitted, switch off or unplug the appliance and keep the door closed in order to stifle any flames.

# **INSTALLATION:**

- 1. Make sure that all the packing materials are removed from the inside of the door.
- 2. WARNING!--Check the oven for any damage, such as misaligned or bent door, damaged door seals and sealing surface, broken or loose door hinges and latches and dents inside the cavity or on the door. If there is any damage, do not operate the oven and contact qualified service personnel.
- 3. This microwave oven must be placed on a flat, stable surface to hold its weight and the heaviest food likely to be cooked in the oven.
- 4. Do not place the oven where heat, moisture, or high humidity are generated, or near combustible materials.
- 5. For correct operation, the oven must have sufficient airflow. Allow 20cm of space above the oven, 10cm at back and 5cm at both sides. Do not cover or block any openings on the appliance. Do not remove feet.



- 6. Make sure that the power supply cord is undamaged and does not run under the oven or over any hot or sharp surface.
- 7. The socket must be readily accessible so that it can be easily unplugged in an emergency.
- 8. Do not use the oven outdoors.

## **RADIO INTERFERENCE:**

Operation of the microwave oven can cause interference to your radio, TV, or similar equipment. When there is interference, it may be reduced or eliminated by taking the following measures:

- 1. Clean door and sealing surface of the oven.
- 2. Reorient the receiving antenna of radio or television.
- 3. Relocate the microwave oven with respect to the receiver.
- 4. Move the microwave oven away from the receiver.
- 5. Plug the microwave oven into a different outlet so that microwave oven and receiver are on different branch circuits.

## **MICROWAVE COOKING PRINCIPLES:**

- 1. Arrange food carefully. Place thickest areas towards outside of dish.
- 2. Watch cooking time. Cook for the shortest amount of time indicated and add more as needed. Food severely overcooked can smoke or ignite
- 3. Cover foods while cooking. Covers prevent spattering and help foods to cook evenly.
- 4. Turn foods over once during microwave cooking to speed cooking of such foods as chicken and hamburgers. Large items like roasts must be turned over at least once.
- 5. Rearrange foods such as meatballs halfway through cooking both from top to bottom and from the center of the dish to the outside.

## **GROUNDING INSTRUCTIONS:**

This appliance must be grounded. This oven is equipped with a cord having a grounding wire with a grounding plug. It must be plugged into a wall receptacle that is properly installed and grounded. In the event of an electrical short circuit, grounding reduces risk of electric shock by providing an escape wire for the electric current. It is recommended that a separate circuit serving only the oven be provided. Using a high voltage is dangerous and may result in a fire or other accident causing oven damage.

WARNING! Improper use of the grounding plug can result in a risk of electric shock. Note:

- 1. If you have any questions about the grounding or electrical instructions, consult a qualified electrician or service person.
  - 2. Neither the manufacturer nor the dealer can accept any liability for damage to the oven or personal injury resulting from failure to observe the electrical connection procedures.

The wires in this cable main are colored in accordance with the following code:

Green and Yellow = EARTH

Blue = NEUTRAL Brown = LIVE

#### **BEFORE YOU CALL FOR SERVICE:**

Before asking for service, please check each item below:

- 1. Check to ensure the oven is plugged in securely. If not, remove the plug from the outlet, wait 10 seconds, and plug it in again securely.
- 2. Check for a blown circuit fuse or a tripped main circuit breaker. If these seem to be operating properly, test the outlet with another appliance.
- 3. Check to ensure the control panel is programmed correctly and the timer is set..
- 4. Check to ensure the door is securely closed, engaging the door lock system. If the door is not properly closed, the microwave energy will not flow inside.

IF NONE OF THE ABOVE RECTIFIES THE SITUATION, THEN CONTACT A QUALIFIED TECHNICIAN. DO NOT TRY TO ADJUST OR REPAIR THE OVEN YOURSELF.



## **UTENSILS GUIDE:**


- 1. Microwave cannot penetrate metal. Only use utensils that are suitable for use in microwave ovens. Metallic containers for food and beverages are not allowed during microwave cooking. This requirement is not applicable if the manufacturer specifies size and shape of metallic containers suitable for microwave cooking
- 2. Microwave cannot penetrate metal, so metal utensils or dishes with metallic trim should not be used.
- 3. Do not use recycled paper products when microwave cooking, as they may contain small metal fragments which may cause sparks and/or fires.
- 4. Round /oval dishes rather than square/oblong ones are recommend, as food in corners tends to overcook.
- 5. Narrow strips of aluminum foil may be used to prevent overcooking of exposed areas. But be careful don't use too much and keep a distance of 1 inch (2.54cm) between foil and cavity.

The list below is a general guide to help you select the correct utensils.



# **DIAGRAM AND CONTROL PANEL:**



- 1. Door Safety Lock System
- 2. Oven Window
- 3. Control Panel
- 4. Digital display window
- 5. Power level pad
- 6. X2 pad
- 7. Program pad
- 8. Stop/Reset pad
- 9. Start pad
- 10. Number/Memory pads



# **DIGITAL DISPLAY ACTION INDICATORS:**



- 1. X2 indicating cooking in X2 feature.
- 2. PROG indicating programming a cooking.
- 3. Numbers indicating the cooking stage.
- 4. Indicating power level used in cooking.

## **HOW TO SET THE OVEN CONTROLS:**

When power on, beep will sound and blue backlight is lit, display shows"0", the oven enter to waiting mode.

During cook setting process, the system will return to waiting mode if there is not any operation within 1 minute.

During cooking program, press STOP/RESET pad to pause the program, and then press START to resume. Press STOP/RESET twice to cancel the program.

"0" will flash with 4 beeps to remind the program is over, and it will sound every two minutes until user press any pad or open the door.



#### TIME AND POWER LEVEL COOKING

Select a cooking power level and then use the number pads to set cooking time before touching the START pad. The longest cooking time is 99 minutes 99 seconds.

Touch POWER LEVEL pad	Power Description
Once	HI
Twice	MED
Thrice	DEF

For a single stage cooking, here is an example to set cooking power at full (HI) and cook for 3 minutes:

- 1. Touch POWER LEVEL pad once.
- 2. Touch number pads 3, 0, 0.
- 3. Touch START pad.

## SAVE A COOKING TO A NUMBER KEY

For frequently used cooking program, you can save it to a number key and conveniently activate it by touching the number key and then START pad.

Each of the number keys is pre-set with a cooking program. In waiting mode, touch any of the ten number pads, you are selecting a cooking program, then press START pad to start the preset program.

The following are default settings for each of the number keys:

Number/Memory Pads	1	2	3	4	5	6	7	8	9	0
Preset Cooking Time	:10	:20	:30	:45	1:00	1:30	2:00	2:30	3:00	3:30

The user is free to reset the cooking program stored under each of the ten number keys anytime. In order to set a cooking program which may contain up to 3 stages consecutive cooking periods with different power levels, and to designate a number key to this program, see the example bellow:

To set medium power cooking for 8 min. and save it to number pad 5:

- 1. Touch PROG once.
- 2. Press number pad 5.
- 3. Press POWER LEVEL twice to select MED.
- 4. Touch number pads 8. 0. 0.
- 5. Press PROG to save.

You can set a two or three stages cooking program by repeating the steps 3-4 once or twice. After finished to save, press START pad to start cooking, accumulation cooking time will display. If the cooking time greater than 60 minutes, the display will show "1H"

**Note**: If you want the oven to start cooking immediately after you touching any of the number keys which save the cooking program you frequently used instead of after you touching the START pad, following the steps;

**TO SET**: Press and hold down STOP/RESET for 5 sec until "P L" appears on display; now you don't need to press START pad after selecting a cooking program by touching any of the number keys.

**TO CANCEL**: After finished to save a cooking menu, the oven in waiting mode, press and hold down STOP/RESET for 5 sec until "P" appears on display, now you need to press START pad after selecting a cooking program by touching any of the number keys

#### HOW TO USE THE X2 PAD

More cooking programs can be stored under the number keys by using the X2 function.

In waiting mode, press X2, any of the number keys, and the START pad.

The following are default settings for each of the number key.

Number/Memory Pads	1	2	3	4	5	6	7	8	9	0
Preset Cooking Time	:20	:40	1:00	1:30	2:00	3:00	4:00	5:00	6:00	7:00

X2 function can only program one stage cooking. After setting is finished, press STOP/RESET to return to waiting mode. The oven will



start after you touching X2, any of the number keys and then the START pad.

For example, to use the X2 function, and save a program of full power and 3 minutes cooking to number pad 8.

- 1. Touch PROG once.
- 2. Touch X2 pad once.
- 3. Press number pad 8.
- 4. Press POWER LEVEL once.
- 5. Touch number pads 3, 0, 0.
- 6. Press PROG to save.

**Note**: If you want the oven to start cooking immediately after you touching any of the number keys which save the cooking program you frequently used instead of after you touching the START pad, following the steps:

**TO SET**: Press and hold down STOP/RESET for 5 sec until "P L" appears on display; now you don't need to press START pad after selecting a cooking program by touching X2 and any of the number keys.

**TO CANCEL**: In waiting mode, press and hold STOP/RESET for 5seconds until "P" appears on display, now you need to press START pad after selecting a cooking program by touching X2 and any of number keys.

#### **COUNT OF OPERATIONS**

You can read the count of how many times the oven has been used. To do this,

- 1. In waiting mode, press and hold down STOP/RESET.
- 2. Touch POWER LEVEL pad. The number on display shows how many times the oven has been used.

This function is for the user to analyze the usage of the oven and the traffic flow at a particular location where the oven is being used commercially.

#### CHILD LOCK

TO SET: In waiting mode, press and hold PROG for 5 seconds. The oven is locked.

To release child lock,

TO CANCEL: Press and hold PROG for 5 seconds, the oven goes to normal

## RESTORE FACTORY DEFAULTS SETTING

#### TO SET:

Press and hold STSRT pad, power on, all symbols lit once in the screen, at last "00:00" will show in the screen.

Press"1","2","3","4","5","6","7","8","9","0","POWER LEVEL","X2","PROG","STOP/RESET","START" button once,"00:15"will display, open the door, and then shut, open the door again, beep will sound and the oven will return to waiting mode,"0"will display, Restore Factory default settings have been took effect.

## **CLEANING AND CARE**

- 1. Turn off the oven and unplug the power cord from the wall when cleaning.
- 2. Keep the inside of the oven clean. When food splatters or spilled liquids adhere to oven walls, wipe with a damp cloth. Mild detergents may be used if the oven gets very dirty. Avoid using spray or other harsh cleaners. They may stain, streak or dull the door surface.
- 3. The outside of the oven should be cleaned with a damp cloth. To prevent damage to the operating parts inside the oven, water should not be allowed to seep into the ventilation openings.
- 4. Wipe the door and window on both sides, the door seals and adjacent parts frequently with a damp cloth to remove any spills or spatters. Do not use abrasive cleaner.
- 5. A steam cleaner is not be used.
- 6. Do not allow the control panel to become wet. Clean with a soft, damp cloth. When cleaning the control panel, leave oven door open to prevent oven from accidentally turning on.
- 7. If steam accumulates inside or around the outside of the oven door, wipe with a soft cloth. This may occur when the microwave oven is operated under high humidity condition. And it is normal.
- 8. The oven floor should be cleaned regularly to avoid excessive noise. Simply wipe the bottom surface of the oven with mild detergent.

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- 9. Remove odors from your oven by combining a cup of water with the juice and skin of one lemon in a microwaveable bowl. Microwave for 5 minutes. Wipe thoroughly and dry with a soft cloth.
- 10. If the light bulb burns out, please contact customer service to have it replaced.
- 11. The oven should be cleaned regularly and any food deposits should be removed. Failure to maintain the oven in a clean condition could lead to deterioration of surface that could adversely affect the life of the unit and could possibly result in a hazardous situation.
- 12. Please do not dispose of this appliance into the domestic rubbish bin; it should be disposed to the particular disposal center provided by the municipalities.
